## Contractor Training Update

## Apply for the Small Works Roster

The Small Works Roster is used to obtain the names of Washington state licensed contractors who are interested in bidding projects for Washington state government organizations. This roster is used by some public agencies for projects under \$300,000.

The RainWise program has been talking with the Seattle Housing Authority (SHA) about putting RainWise installations on numerous SHA buildings in eligible areas. The SHA frequently uses the Small Works Roster to find contractors for their projects and will likely use this roster for their RainWise projects as well. ## ASK AN INSPECTOR



**With the recent below freezing temperatures across Seattle, should I be talking with my customers about the freezing potential of pipes?**



Yes, it would be a good idea to talk with property owners about the freezing potential of pipes, in particular for cistern outflow connections. Cisterns that discharge to a dispersion trench rather than side sewer or rain garden have the potential to create icy sidewalks when a rain event is followed by freezing temperatures. Please tell your customers to pay attention to the weather and to monitor the outflow of the cistern to dispersion trenches. The same concern holds true for the rain garden overflow when freezing temperatures quickly follow a rain storm.

## A Tip for Securing Slim Line Cisterns

A few of you have been asking us to share easy methods for securing slim line cisterns. Some contractors have found DUCKBILL anchors to be a good and an easy to install system that does not require drilling into house siding.

## 2016: Year in Review

Congratulations to our most productive contractors in 2016: Garden Seasoning (Monsoon Rain Gardens), HomeGrown Organics, Rain Dog Designs, and Stone Soup Gardens! Together, you installed over 50 percent of RainWise projects in 2016.

**Thanks to the work of all of our contractors, RainWise completed over 300 installations this past year.** This was a huge year for cisterns as about 70 percent of these projects included at least one cistern (16 percent included rain gardens and cisterns). Our most active basins were Green Lake/Unversity (32% of projects) followed by Barton (16%) followed by Henderson (11%) and Ballard (10%).



RainWise was particularly proud to hit the milestone of our 1,000th RainWise installation over the summer. Collectively, since the program began in 2010, we have installed over 1,180 rain garden and/or cistern projects and are managing over 18 million gallons of stormwater annually.
